

Suggested activities based on The Snail and the Whale

Literacy

- Vocabulary- with your partner look up these words then put three of your favourite ones in sentences:
- Slithered Gazed Sniffed Looped Immensely Towering Hideous Earsplitting Moaned Fetching
- Idioms or sayings-Itchy foot is a saying or we call it an idiom it doesn't mean that the snail in our story actually had an itchy foot! She just wanted to travel around the world.
- Find out what these sayings mean-
 - 'Give it a shot'
 - 'Let the cat out of the bag'
 - 'Speak your mind'
- Writing - These are some of the creatures we see in this story as the whale and the snail travel all over the Earth's oceans:
- Parrot Seal Cat Crab Monkey Dolphin Bear Dog Shark Seagull.
- Choose two of these creatures and write a poem or short story about how they became friends

Science

- Do a project on the Humpback whale
- Do a project on the Sea Snail
- Headings to help you:
 - What the creature looks like
 - What food it eats
 - Where you will find it
 - What you like most about this creature

Geography

- Humpback whales breed near the Equator find some countries near the Equator on your map
